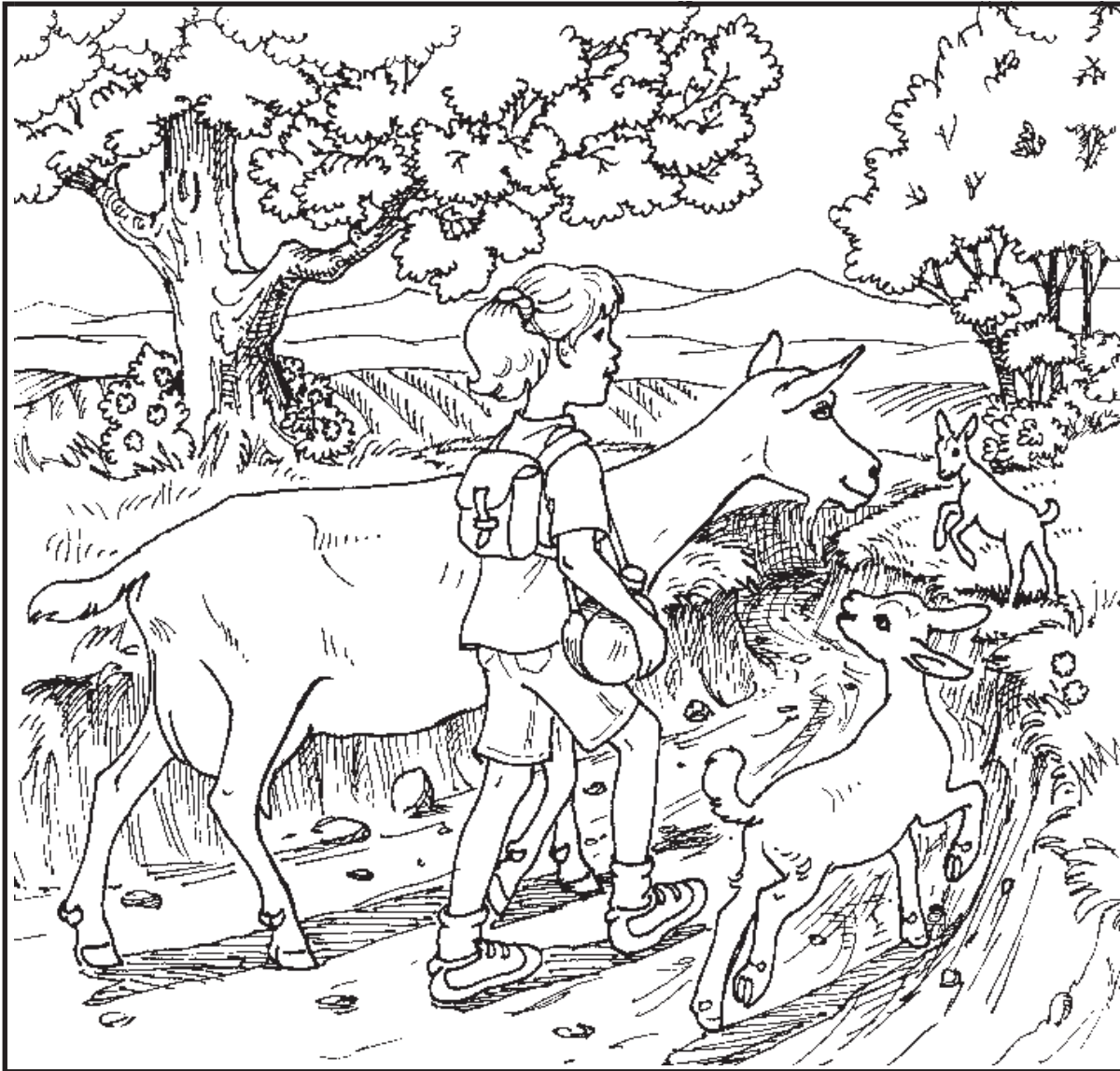

GOATNOTES

- Goats are used for milk, meat and fibre production
- Male goats are called "bucks", female goats are "does"
- Goats generally breed in the fall and kid in the spring
- Gestation (pregnancy) lasts five months
- Goats usually have twins or triplets; babies are called "kids"
- The dairy breeds of goats are: Alpine, LaMancha, Nubian, Oberhasli, Saanen and Toggenburg
- Angora and Cashmere goats are the fibre breeds
- The meat breeds of goats are Boer and Spanish
- Pygmy and Nigerian Dwarf goats are miniature breeds
- 90% of the world's goats live in tropical & sub-tropical areas
- More chevon (goat meat) is eaten in the world than any other red meat
- More than half the world's population drinks goat milk
- Goats eat hay & grain, similar to cattle & sheep
